### Who we are

Parent and Staff Governors are self-explanatory, but some other titles may need explanation! Foundation Governors are here to help preserve the Christian character of the school, Local Authority Governors provide a link with our area's public services, and Co-opted Governors are people from the local community who have special skills that help us do our work. All the Governors are volunteers.



## Our role

Governors are here to help the School provide the best possible education for our children and meet all its legal and policy requirements. We help to set the School's vision and aims, and oversee important things like the budget and appointments. It's not our job to get involved in the day-to-day running of the school, but we do like to play a part in school life, talking to children, teachers, teaching assistants, lunchtime supervisors, office administration staff and parents and carers to make sure everyone is happy, by supporting their well being. We respond to any issues that may arise which concern governors. The Full Governing body meet every term and we have sub-committees that get together to look in detail at areas like Teaching and Learning and Resources.

## What we do

As well as meeting together, the Governors take a keen interest in the school and support it in various ways. In the Autumn Term we:

- Met regularly with Mrs Battersby to talk about the school and offer support
- Chatted with teachers to see how subjects are being taught
- Helped at school lunches and chatted to children about their school days
- Were active in the early stages of the project to improve the school grounds
- Joined in with events like the wonderful Christmas Nativity and the Santa Dash (and bought lots of cake afterwards).
