Privacy Notice (How we use Pupil Information)

The categories of pupil information that we collect, hold and share include:

- Personal information (such as name, unique pupil number and address);
- Characteristics (such as ethnicity, language, nationality, religion, country of birth and free school meal eligibility);
- Attendance information (such as sessions attended, number of absences and absence reasons);
- Assessment information (such as internal assessment data, statutory test evidence and marks);
- Relevant medical information (such as requests for time off school for appointments, medical issues, medication use/permissions, administration of medication information);
- Special Educational Needs information (such as EHCP, reports from external agencies, Individual Education Plans);
- Safeguarding information (such as records of issues, referrals to the Hub, meeting notes);
- Behavioural information (such as exclusion data, behaviour logs, incident logs).

Why we collect and use this information

We use the pupil data:

- to support pupil learning;
- to monitor and report on pupil progress;
- to provide appropriate pastoral/medical care;
- to ensure the safety of our pupils;
- to assess the quality of our services;
- to provide additional services, such as school dinners, music tuition;
- to comply with the law regarding data sharing.

The lawful basis on which we use this information

We collect and use pupil information under **the following conditions for lawful processing:**

6 (1) (c) Necessary for compliance with a legal obligation eg DfE census returns

6 (1) (d) Necessary to protect the vital interests of a data subject or another person

6 (1) (e) Necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller

and for special categories:

9 (2) (h) For preventative/occupational medicine; assessing work capacity of an employee, medical diagnosis, providing health/social care/treatment or management of healthcare services under EU/National law or contract with a health professional.

Collecting pupil information

Whilst the majority of pupil information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it is provided to us on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with the General Data Protection Regulation, we will inform you whether you are required to provide certain pupil information to us or if you have a choice in this.

Storing pupil data

We hold pupil data for the length of time the pupil remains at Cartmel CE Primary School. Records created by school to obtain approval for Educational Visits outside the classroom shall be retained from the date of the visit for 14 years. Child Protection information will be retained indefinitely.

Who we share pupil information with

We routinely share pupil information with:

- schools that the pupils attend after leaving us;
- our local authority;
- the Department for Education (DfE);
- School Nurse/NHS professionals/Barnados;
- Cumbria Music Services and other peripatetic music specialists;
- Local cluster schools for cluster events

Why we share pupil information

We do not share information about our pupils with anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

We share pupils' data with the Department for Education (DfE) on a statutory basis. This data sharing underpins school funding and educational attainment policy and monitoring.

We are required to share information about our pupils with our local authority (LA) and the Department for Education (DfE) under section 3 of The Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013.

Data collection requirements:

The National Pupil Database (NPD)

The NPD is owned and managed by the Department for Education and contains information about pupils in schools in England. It provides invaluable evidence on educational performance to inform independent research, as well as studies commissioned by the Department. It is held in electronic format for statistical purposes. This information is securely collected from a range of sources including schools, local authorities and awarding bodies.

We are required by law, to provide information about our pupils to the DfE as part of statutory data collections such as the school census and early years' census. Some of this information is then stored in the NPD. The law that allows this is the Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013.

The department may share information about our pupils from the NPD with third parties who promote the education or well-being of children in England by:

- conducting research or analysis;
- producing statistics;
- providing information, advice or guidance.

The Department has robust processes in place to ensure the confidentiality of our data is maintained and there are stringent controls in place regarding access and use of the data. Decisions on whether DfE releases data to third parties are subject to a strict approval process and based on a detailed assessment of:

- who is requesting the data;
- the purpose for which it is required;
- the level and sensitivity of data requested; and
- the arrangements in place to store and handle the data.

To be granted access to pupil information, organisations must comply with strict terms and conditions covering the confidentiality and handling of the data, security arrangements and retention and use of the data.

Requesting access to your personal data

Under data protection legislation, parents and pupils have the right to request access to information about them that we hold. To make a request for your personal information, or be given access to your child's educational record, contact the school office.

You also have the right to:

- object to processing of personal data that is likely to cause, or is causing, damage or distress;
- prevent processing for the purpose of direct marketing;
- object to decisions being taken by automated means;
- in certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data rectified, blocked, erased or destroyed; and
- claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the Data Protection regulations.
